The most exciting news from the Wallabies class is that we are back in our freshly painted room! We are impressed with how much brighter the room feels with a fresh lick of paint and are slowly covering the walls with our new learning for Term 2.

In English we are learning about informative texts. So far we have written informative texts about pigs, frogs, butterflies and this week we are learning about the interesting creatures of the elusive octopus. For our assessment we will be creating an informative text about crocodiles! We will be turning this information into a poster and this will later be submitted as an entry into the Forsayth Turnout later in the year.

In Maths, year 2 have been learning
about time. They have been coming
familiar with reading a clock and
interpreting calendars. Students can
now identify time on an analog clock,
including o'clock, quarter past, half
past and quarter to times. The rest of
us continue to consolidate our
understanding of number concepts and

becoming more familiar with different **I** ways to represent numbers.

In Week 3, for HASS we had an interesting visit from a local member of the community to share stories of their past. Raymond Bethel kindly offered his time to help us understand what life was like when attending school at Georgetown State School 60 years ago. The class was very curious about school in the past and they had lots of questions as they learned about how some things are the same, but many things were different, including the fact that there was no electricity, only one building (the current Wallabies room) and the lunch shed (formerly the 11 o'clock shed), only a sports uniform, no technology, and the thing that caught their interest the most, was students receiving the cuts for not meeting school expectations. Thanks again to Raymond for kindly volunteering his time to share these experiences, it gives the Year 1s and 2s plenty to write about for their 🛽 assessment.


WALLABIES... CONTINUED




